Quelques paroles de Monsieur le Cure

Grant that all the faithful of the Church, looking into the signs of the times by the light of faith, may constantly devote themselves to the service of the Gospel. (Eucharistic Prayer For Use In Masses for Various Needs III)

This Eucharistic Prayer is familiar only to those who attend Mass on weekdays during Ordinary Time and then only on certain days that permit the use of this Eucharistic Prayer.

The recent attack on innocent people in Las Vegas is a "sign of the times," the continued escalation of the level of violence in our country. The victims were innocently enjoying a concert when a gunman, for reasons unknown, deliberately and viciously attacked them.

As a people of faith, the challenge before us is to look at this "sign of the times by the light of faith."

Our faith certainly informs us that this is a manifestation of evil. There is unquestionably the presence and the influence of the diabolical, but there is also human cooperation.

Faith- our personal, intimate relationship with Christ Jesus- leads us to turn to Him for wisdom and courage, for healing and consolation, for deliverance.

The Lord, for His part, already having forewarned us about the evil one, bids us turn to Him for healing from all desire for revenge and for deliverance from the influence of the devil. If we wish to receive the power of His healing touch and the solace of His consolation, we must forgive, even so great an affront to human life itself.

Christ's gift of wisdom leads us to look deeply into our own hearts and to courageously confront our own tendencies to violence. Our tendencies may not be as brutal, but violence inevitably compounds itself. Lack of civility in social discourse, rudeness, and lack of consideration of others do violence to others. Harsh judgments and gossip do violence to others. Failure to respect the opinion of others and disagree graciously does violence to others.

As a people who have a personal, intimate relationship with Christ Jesus, we see clearly the "signs of the times" and we respond in a manner consistent with that relationship. We need to be true to our God and true to ourselves.

Let us pray for our country and all who govern, for those who were brutally murdered in Las Vegas, for the other victims, for the families as they try to make sense of this evil, and for one another.
