# Quelques paroles de Monsieur le Cure

Before I could finish this, I heard the news about the tragic shooting of Congressman Scalise and others. Initially I intended to refer to the many acts of violence that plague our world.

It is impossible to watch the news or read a newspaper without being informed of some act of violence.

The causes of violence are many. There certainly is a considerable amount of anger in our country. Civility is deteriorating rapidly; there is so much hatred and division.

Although our community has not experienced the physical violence, there is a serious lack of civility and considerable hateful speech. There is too much mean-spiritedness.

Do we dare to search our hearts and turn away from these evils so as to turn to the Lord Jesus?

Friday, June 23, is the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. My devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus has roots in my childhood. Mass on the First Friday of the month in honor of the Sacred Heart has been a part of my life since childhood. I frequently use the Votive Mass of the Sacred Heart when permitted on any Friday of the year.

Decades ago, when travel in Europe was relatively inexpensive, I had the opportunity to visit the monastery of the Visitation Nuns in Paray-le-Monial. St. Margaret Mary Alacoque experienced several apparitions of Our Lord there in the Seventeenth Century.

Our Lord revealed His Sacred Heart to her, leading her to experience deeply the mystery of His love and compassion, tenderness and mercy.

After celebrating Mass at the tomb of St. Margaret Mary, I had time to pray in that chapel where our Lord Himself appeared. As I was praying, I remembered that the nuns were forced to flee from the monastery during the French Revolution. This chapel, the site of a miracle, was used as a barn during the revolution.

This is such a juxtaposition: the love and mercy of God, the hatred and violence of man.

The same dynamic is amongst us today. The challenge is which do we choose. Do we choose to live in the love and mercy of God or do we contribute to the hatred and violence?

I encourage you to attend the Mass this Friday at midday. If you are not able to attend Mass, consider reflecting upon the readings of the day. You can find them listed in this bulletin.

As a people of faith, let us make reparation for our own sins and renew ourselves in the love and mercy of the Sacred Heart of the Lord Jesus.
