# Quelques paroles de Monsieur le Cure

The eruptions of violence in our country are disturbing.

The youth of the participants in these acts of violence is also disconcerting, insofar as it raises serious questions about our future as a nation. Will there ever be an end to violence in this country?

There should be no doubt in the mind of people of faith that racism, prejudice, and discrimination are morally wrong because they are offenses against the God-given dignity of the human person. God gives humanity this dignity because all people are created in the image and likeness of God.

Moreover as a people of faith, we believe that the Person of Christ Jesus creates a new order in creation that makes us truly brothers and sisters in Him, sons and daughters of the same Heavenly Father.

Society furthermore has a legitimate right to tranquility. It is never acceptable for an individual or group, no matter how worthy their cause, to disrupt the public good by resorting to violent and destructive tactics to further their cause. This nation has laws that establish the rights of individuals and groups, facilitate the pursuit of truth, provide means for civil discourse, and adjudicate conflicts of rights between parties.

At the same time these tragic events invite each of us to look deeply into our hearts and to examine carefully our consciences. This search and examination, done in the fullness of light and truth that flows from the Gospel, should lead each of us to an honest assessment of the manner in which we express ourselves.

Do we always, no matter how volatile the topic, maintain a personal respect for the dignity of those with whom we disagree? Do we express our differences of opinion in an open and recognizable forum where the others can be sincerely informed of our opinions on the controversial issue? When there is no resolution to the differences, do we accept that situation with civility, always respecting others?

Wisdom teaches us that harmony of thoughts, ideas, perspectives, and opinions are not always possible. Maturity demands that we learn to live graciously with diversity. Even the pursuit of truth is characterized by differing interpretations of that truth. Hence, as a nation and as citizens of the world, we learn the necessity of compromise and tolerance, negotiation and diplomacy.

These dynamics are applicable in our homes, neighborhoods, workplaces, schools, and churches. To the extent that we not only follow this path, but also turn to prayer to seek God's assistance, we will not only be free of violence, but we will also eventually know real peace.
