With the exception of a very few days, it is still hot here. Fall seems to be skipping us completely.

Friday night football games have been hot, humid, and muggy. Halloween costumes must have been uncomfortable.

The theory remains that summer is over, fall is here, winter rapidly approaches. This changing of the seasons requires the extensive use of our imaginations because our sight tells us the weather has not changed from the days of summer.

Our society observes not only the seasons, but also a number of holidays. A few months ago, for example, the stores were advertising Halloween decorations and candy. Items surrounding Thanksgiving Day are already being promoted. Christmas decorations should be out within a few weeks.

It all happens so early and so fast that it borders on overload. Would it be possible to prepare for each holiday just a short time before the actual date? Do we really need to listen to Christmas carols in November?

Are we not just being pulled along much too quickly? After all, the purpose of these holidays is to bring joy into our lives, not stress.

Just as the earth has seasons, the Church also has different seasons: Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, and Ordinary Time. The First Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of the Church Year and the Saturday following the Solemnity of Christ the King marks the end of the Church Year.
