# Quelques paroles de Monsieur le Cure

Does it really matter?

Although an interrogatory sentence, the expected reply is to be in the negative.

The scenario is as follows. Declaration: Does it really matter? Mandatory response: No, it does not.

Hence the subject of the conversation is dropped, presumably because it is irrelevant.

This may serve as an example. A couple of people watch the evening news together. There is a segment on the deportation of illegal immigrants. The segment causes a discussion about immigrants both legal and illegal. Each of the two people takes an opposing view on the topic. The discussion becomes heated. Shortly thereafter one says to the other, "Does it really matter?" The other person knows infallibly that the only answer to the question is, "No, it really does not."

One may substitute any controversial topic for immigration: abortion, same sex unions, the president, the supreme court, welfare, unemployment benefits, taxes, stem cell research, cloning, education, health insurance, terrorists, government subsidies to agriculture, OPEC, the United Nations. This is not a taxative list.

These and other issues are controversial, divisive, and complicated.

People may, in good conscience, have different opinions. However, not taking a position on most of these because "it really doesn't matter" is problematic. This response creates indifference.

If one is constantly avoiding important issues because of indifference, then the question arises as to what does matter.

If issues touching upon human dignity, fundamental rights, and justice are avoided, then evil will triumph.

Is this an exaggeration?

I have read two books recently about the diplomatic relations between the Vatican and Germany in the years leading to World War II. Deeply appreciating the complexity of the era, I nonetheless could not but see the useless efforts of good people to reason and compromise with those who eventually gained control of the government in Germany.

Good people chose not to take issue with the laws affecting Jews, those with special needs, and opposing political parties.

Germany was overwhelmingly Christian. Catholics, Lutherans, and other Protestants were devout, pious, highly moral. They chose, with few exceptions, not to challenge the ascending power about issues touching upon the sacredness of human life, the dignity of the human person, justice, and the rule of law.

We know the results of their decision.

The next time an important discussion is dismissed with "Does it really matter," we may want to respond with "Yes, it really does."
