Quelques paroles de Monsieur le Cure

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

These words from the ritual for the imposition of ashes will be repeated in small churches and great cathedrals throughout the world on Ash Wednesday. People of all races, ages, incomes, and education will process to altars throughout the world to participate in this ancient custom.

Catholics who attend Mass extremely rarely will make their way to church for the imposition of ashes. Participation in this ritual is increasing rapidly in popularity with young Catholics. There will also be a significant number of people who are not Catholics who will make their way to a Catholic Church to receive the ashes.

There are many reasons motivating all these people to receive the ashes. One of the more compelling is the powerful reminder of mortality.

At least in our culture, efforts are made to mask the harsh reality of death. These efforts are futile.

The blessing and imposition of ashes at the beginning of Lent reminds us dramatically that we shall all experience death some day. At the same time, the ritual reminds us of the importance of living well.

The Lenten Season therefore becomes a moment of grace as we make the effort to respond to the call of the Lord to die to our self-absorption, to free ourselves from the tyranny of our negative emotions, to become more compassionate and tolerant, to grow in charity.

If we are to respond to the call of the Lord, we need to hear the call. Only in the intimacy of prayer will we be able to hear the call and to discern the direction he wishes us to follow.

More frequent attendance at Mass is a great assistance in having a fruitful Lent. If that is not possible because of some commitment, try reflecting on the readings for daily Mass. These are regularly published in this bulletin.

Centennial News: On February 23, 1957, Bishop Jules B. Jeanmard died at the age of 77. He served as the first Bishop of Lafayette for over 37 years. In that time he oversaw incredible growth for the diocese. One of Bishop Jeanmard's lasting legacies was his service to African Americans in the Diocese. In his will, he requested that his body be laid after his death at St. Paul's before it was brought to the Cathedral for the funeral and burial. Jeanmard's death made national news as *Life* magazine ran a picture of black parishioners offering their respects to Bishop Jeanmard, with the caption: "Last Homage to Negroes' friend."

Centennial Indulgence: An Indulgence granted by Pope Francis can be gained throughout this Centennial Year by all who visit the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist and pray the Centennial Prayer (with the usual conditions for an Indulgence). Please see the diocesan web page for more information. The Centennial Prayer is in the Cathedral or you may print it from the web page (available in various languages on the web page).

Lenten Regulations: We are invited to enter into this penitential season as a community (c. 1249). The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence, that is, we do not eat meat. This applies to everyone from the age of fourteen on. Adults are obliged to the law of fasting until the age of sixty. Good Friday is a day of both abstinence and fasting. The purpose of abstinence and fasting is to foster a deeper experience of prayer, encourage pious devotions, emphasize acts of charity, and promote fulfilling our duties and responsibilities with greater diligence (c. 1249). In forming their children, parents should introduce them in accord with their age to the values of self-denial and the importance of making sacrifices.

Centennial Items: Centennial paperweights, yard signs, and history books can be purchased at the following locations: Immaculata Center, the Cathedral of St. John gift shop (both in Lafayette), St. Martin of Tours Church (St. Martinville), Queen of Angels (Opelousas), Crossroads Bookstore, and Acadian Religious Shop (both in Lafayette).

Lenten Daily Mass: During the Lenten Season, Mass on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday is at 6:30 a.m. Way of the Cross followed by Mass on Fridays begins at 5:30 p.m. There will be an additional Mass on Saturday mornings at 8. The Masses on Saturday afternoon and Sunday are at the usual times. Confessions will be heard before each weekday and weekend Mass.
